You should provide your full name, date of birth, nationality, passport number, contact telephone number, and your BRP and case reference number along with an explanation of what is wrong with the BRP. The card has a unique number in the top right hand corner. The unique number for your card is shown at the top of this letter. You should keep this letter safe and in a separate place to your card as you will need this number to apply for a replacement card if yours is lost, stolen or damaged. You should also take a photocopy of the front and back of the card for your own records.

A leaflet is enclosed which provides further important information about the card. Please read it and keep it safe so you can refer to it again in the future.
